The district will assume that all students will be able to be involved in EMIAR unless notified by the parents/guardians in writing.</p> <p><u>Use Of EMIAR By Nonschool Personnel</u></p> <p>The district recognizes that parents/guardians, family members, nonschool personnel, agencies, and media may want to use EMIAR for school-related activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Parents/Guardians and family members shall be authorized to use EMIAR to photograph or videotape their children and/or family member, with the consent of the district administrator or teacher who is in charge of the subject activity. The district hereby declares that any incidental taping of any other students by the above persons will not be harmful nor an invasion of privacy. 2. Nonschool personnel, agencies, and media are required to obtain prior consent from the proper district administrator or teacher before using EMIAR in any school environment, including those activities that are conducted in a public forum. 3. The district reserves the right to restrict or prohibit the use of EMIAR from any classroom performance, group activity, curricular activity, extracurricular activity or individual student performance. <p><u>Use Of EMIAR For Disciplinary Action</u></p>
<p>Pol. 218, 810</p>	<p>The Board delegates to the Superintendent the authority to permit administrators to use EMIAR for disciplinary action. EMIAR, for disciplinary action, may be authorized for use in school buildings, on school property, off school property while students are going to and from school or participating in school-sponsored events, and in vehicles either owned or leased by the district for purposes of transporting students to school and/or other school-related activities.</p> <p>EMIAR taken for disciplinary action may be used for, but not limited to, the following purposes:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Displaying the conduct of student(s) in question. 2. Displaying the conduct in question to the student's or students' parent(s)/guardian(s).
